**Eng:** “We got the specs last minute from product”

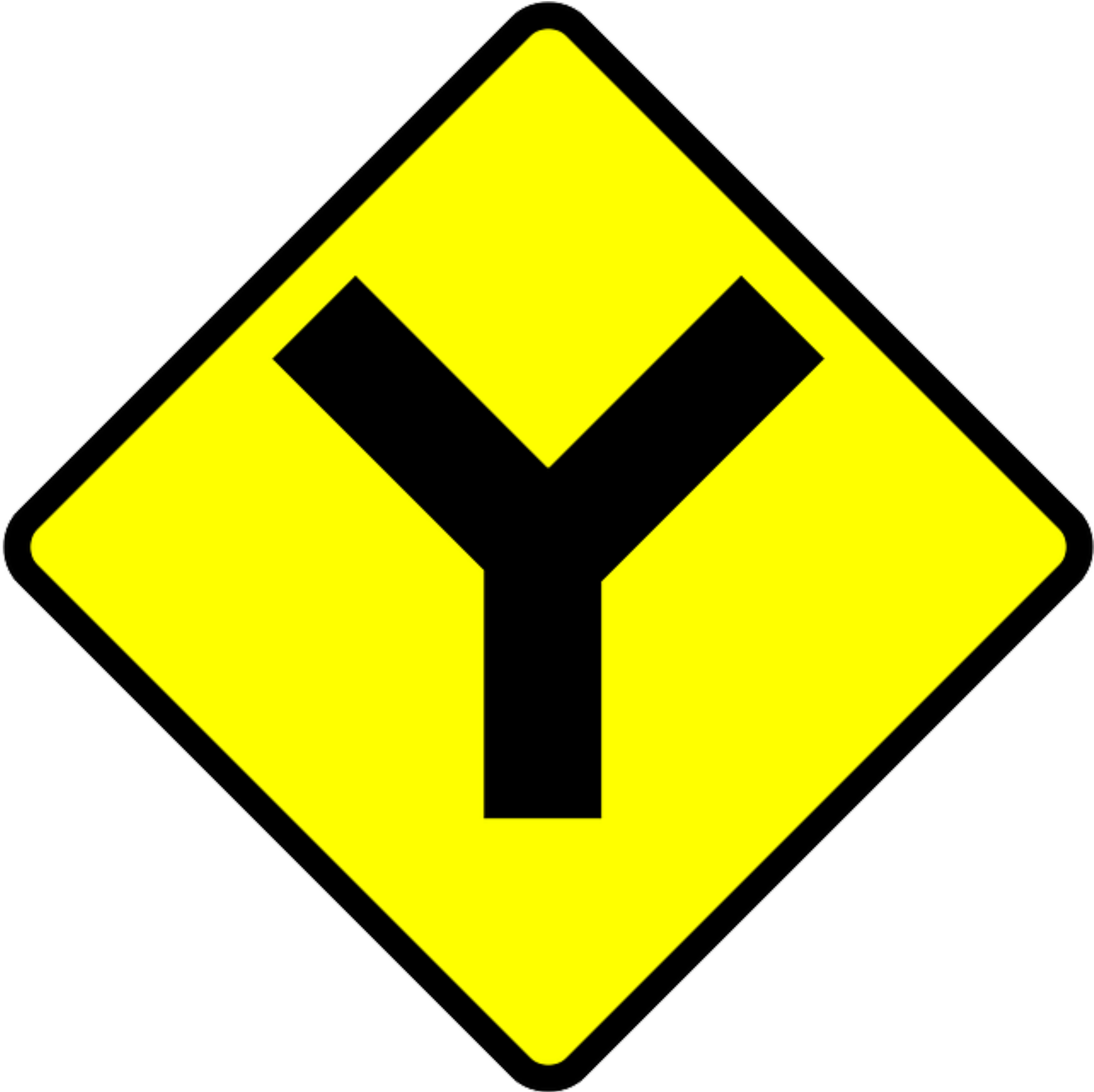
“Why did we get the specs delivered last minute?”
